



The Lumiato theater company was created in 2008, in Buenos Aires, Argentina, by Thiago Bresani and Soledad Garcia, during their training as puppeteers at the University of San Martin, where they studied various theater languages in animated forms. It is the first company to research, produce and disseminate shadow theater in the central-western region of Brazil. With original dramaturgy in its shows and a modern approach, resulting in visually stunning and emotionally impactful performances, it addresses social, political and emotional issues, offering a deep reflection on the human condition. Additionally, Lumiato is known for collaborating with other artists and institutions, further pushing the boundaries of shadow theater. His shows are often praised for their originality, aesthetic beauty and emotional impact, captivating audiences of all ages around the world. On the national and international scene, Companhia Lumiato has won awards and recognition for its contribution to the enrichment of the performing arts and for its ability to enchant spectators of all ages.

Sinopse

An Indigenous from the village dreams of a supernatural woman. When he wakes up, he seeks advice from the village's Pajé to try to understand the mysteries of this woman and discovers the story of lara. Enchanted by the siren, he plunges into his own destiny. Created with the younger public in mind, the play is inspired by lara's indigenous legend and using contemporary shadow Theatre resources and it aims to raise awareness of oral traditions of indigenous people of Brazil.

Contemporany Shadow Theatre

lara - is the mythical legend about a siren told by the indigenous peoples of Brazil. In this play indigenous and foreign references blend together into a new form. With music and forms as the central element, the story is told almost without words. Lights, textures and shadows are projected behind and in front of the screen, creating the mythical silhouettes of bodies and figures that merge into new stunning images.

lara an Amazonian myth

Shadow theater performance inspired by the legend and myth of the Brazilian siren, IARA. It seeks to raise awareness among children and young people about the knowledge of the oral tradition of the original peoples of Brazil. The appreciation of oral traditions is one of the ways to make visible the existence of the original peoples of South America and the importance that they represent in this historical moment in the preservation of forests and waters in Brazil and the world. In this sense, bringing the public closer to representations and symbolic worlds constructed by original cultures contributes to the diversification of socially valued narratives, which have historically been blurred by hegemonic discourses.

In researching the indigenous mythological universe, the theme of the Brazilian siren, lara, was chosen as she found great symbolic potential that allows her to be staged in shadow theater.
